Kemsing Players

The Kemsing Players are delighted to be back on stage after an eighteen-month hiatus, during which we kept ourselves entertained with Zoom quizzes and a murder mystery as well as trying our hand at Facebook videos. All good fun, but not the same as being on stage!

Our November production, directed by Sue Davnall, is *The Hollow* by Agatha Christie - a classic country house murder mystery which Christie herself adapted for the stage. The theatrical version was highly successful, opening in the West End in 1951 and running for eleven months and 376 performances. The original novel featured the renowned detective M. Hercule Poirot but Christie never felt that he sat comfortably within the story so she cut him from the stage version. Instead we have the highly capable Inspector Colquhoun of Scotland Yard with his dependable assistant Detective Sergeant Penny. One Saturday morning the pair are summoned to The Hollow, an elegant dwelling a few miles outside London and the home of retired ambassador Sir Henry Angkatell and his wife Lucy. The Angkatells have been entertaining assorted relatives for the weekend, along with renowned Harley Street doctor John Cristow and his wife Gerda. Murder has been committed and Colquhoun, with Penny, must disentangle the complicated physical and emotional relationships to work out 'whodunnit', and why.

The Hollow is considered to be one of Christie's more accomplished works, with unusually complex characters and a rich assortment of suspects and possible motives. The performance dates are Thursday 25, Friday 26 and Saturday 27 November 2021 with the box office opening on Monday 1 November. 

Sevenoaks Symphony Orchestra

Sevenoaks Symphony Orchestra returns to the Stag Theatre on 21st November at 4pm for a stunning concert featuring four young artists. These players are carving out impressive solo careers and this concerto concert is a wonderful opportunity to hear all four soloists in a varied and exciting programme.

Cellist Jamal Aliyev made his solo debut at the BBC Proms with the BBC Concert Orchestra in 2017 and tours widely as a soloist of exceptional talent. He will be playing Haydn's Cello Concerto in C Major.

Flautist Emma Halnan won the woodwind category in BBC Young Musician 2010 and delights audiences, performing widely with acclaimed orchestras. She will be playing Ibert's Flute Concerto.

Violinist Ionel Manciu began winning international competitions from the age of 11. He performs across Europe and is currently at the London Guildhall on an Artist Junior Fellowship. Ionel will be playing Saint-Saens' Rondo Capriccioso.

Trumpeter Matilda Lloyd hails from Kent and won the BBC Young Musician brass category in 2014. She made her Proms solo debut in 2016 and continues to captivate audiences around the world. Matilda will be playing the Hummel Trumpet Concerto.
